INTRODUCTION

This leaflet sets out HS charges and the value of vouchers available towards the cost of glasses and contact lenses. If you think you might be entitled to help with any of the HS charges in this leaflet, or with the cost of travelling to hospital for HS treatment, pick up leaflet HC11 – *Are you entitled to help with health costs?* It tells you about the help you might be able to get with the cost of the following:

- *Sight tests*
- *Spectacles and contact lenses*
- *HS dental treatment*
- *Travel to hospital for HS treatment*

HS DENTAL TREATMENT

If you can't get free treatment or help with the cost then you pay eighty per cent of the cost of the treatment up to a maximum, currently £384.

<i>Basic examination</i>	£6.74
<i>Extensive clinical examination</i>	£10.13
<i>Simple scale and polish</i>	£10.70
<i>Two small X-rays <u>and one small filling</u></i>	<u>from £11.90</u>
<i>One large filling</i>	from £18.53
<i>A precious metal crown</i>	from £107.07
<i>A full set of plastic dentures</i>	from £146.71
<i>An upper or lower metal denture</i>	from £129.21

Remember that these are only examples of what you might pay for courses of treatment. The total cost of your HS treatment may be different from these examples because of the number, or types, of treatment involved.

If you are registered for Continuing Care with your dentist, you may ask your dentist for a treatment plan. This is provided free of charge and explains what treatment your dentist recommends, the price for each part of the treatment, and the likely total cost.
